# MOVE >>

To help children move their bodies in ways that help them learn...you may ask:

- Can you make your body a sunflower?
- Can you "grow" like a sunflower, blow in the wind, or turn to face the sun?
- Can you go to a sunflower and copy its shape with your body?

### BUILD >>

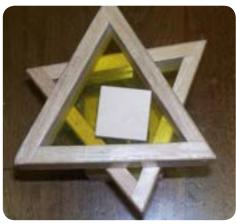
To help children represent their learning, use manipulative materials to explore in a three-dimensional way. Here are some ideas:

- Create paper strip sculptureBuild with a variety of blocks
- Use nature items
- Sculpt with clay doughUse various recyclables

## SKETCH >>

To help children record information and communicate their learning:

- Use clipboards and pencils to sketch have children pick different parts of the flower to sketch
- Use different materials such as colored pencils, oil pastels
- Watercolor to music and focus on color, not detail, as in some abstract prints
